

GRANNY DENIM JACKET

NOTES

This pattern is written in **UK Terms.**

Each sleeve is made up of 20 squares, sewn together to form the sleeve. Make two identical sleeves following the chart Mirroring the placement of each square to ensure they are identical on each side. Each sleeve is then sewn onto the jacket using Yarn A.

Blocking is essential for this pattern.

See chart A for the Square placements on each sleeve.

Increase the number of columns and rows to increase the sizing.

MATERIALS

HOOK(S)

4mm Crochet Hook

YARN

Sirdar Stories Double Knitting 50g / 140m / 153yds approx.

2 x Yarn A Shade 0835 Smile

1 x Yarn B Shade 0811 Fire

1 x Yarn C Shade 0802 Cosmo

1 x Yarn D Shade 0829 Mimosa

1 x Yarn E Shade 0817 Aura

1 x Yarn F Shade 0824 Skinny Dip

1 x Yarn G Shade 0834 Beach Club

1 x Yarn H Shade 0806 Dreamers

1 x Yarn I Shade 0830 After Glow

1 x Yarn J Shade 0828 Golden Hour

YARN ALTERNATIVES

Any DK weight or Cotton Yarn would be a suitable alternative for this pattern.

NOTIONS

Scissors

Stitch marker

Yarn needle

Tailors Awl for punching holes in your Denim jacket

FINAL SIZE

Sleeve = 53cm L

Each square for the measurements included in this pattern should measure approx. 10cm x 10cm. The squares on the reverse of the jacket should measure approx. 6.5cm x 6.5cm.

ABBREVIATIONS

Magic ring – to make a magic ring, hold thread in your hand and wrap working yarn around forefinger twice to create ring, slip ring off your finger and insert hook to pick up

St(s) - Stitches

Sp(s) - Spaces

ch - Chain

tr - Treble Crochet

dc - Double Crochet

dc2tog - Double Crochet 2 together

ss - Slip Stitch

SPECIAL STITCHES

Puff Stitch

Yarn over insert your hook, pull up a loop, repeat 6 times until you have 13 loops on your hook, yarn over and pull through all 13 loops on your hook, ch1 to secure stitch.

TENSION

Tension is not essential for this project.

Each square for the measurements included in this pattern should measure approx. 10cm x 10cm.

The smaller squares on the reverse of the jacket should measure approx. 6.5cm x 6.5cm.

PATTERN STARTS

Begin

Begin by removing the sleeves of your denim jacket using a pair of sharp scissors. Cut along the seam line.

Make 20 Squares in total for each sleeve as follows:

Square 1: R1: Yarn J R2: Yarn E R3: Yarn D R4:

Yarn H R5: Yarn A

Square 2: R1: Yarn F R2: Yarn J R3: Yarn D R4:

Yarn C R5: Yarn A

Square 3: R1: Yarn H R2: Yarn D R3: Yarn F R4:

Yarn J R5: Yarn A

Square 4: R1: Yarn F R2: Yarn B R3: Yarn D R4:

Yarn H R5: Yarn A

Square 5: R1: Yarn C R2: Yarn J R3: Yarn H R4:

Yarn D R5: Yarn A

Square 6: R1: Yarn H R2: Yarn I R3: Yarn G R4:

Yarn E R5: Yarn A

Square 7: R1: Yarn J R2: Yarn F R3: Yarn C R4:

Yarn G R5: Yarn A

Square 8: R1: Yarn E R2: Yarn G R3: Yarn H R4:

Yarn C R5: Yarn A

Square 9: R1: Yarn D R2: Yarn H R3: Yarn F R4:

Square 19: R1: Yarn F R2: Yarn J R3: Yarn D

R4: Yarn H R5: Yarn A

Square 20: R1: Yarn E R2: Yarn J R3: Yarn G

R4: Yarn F R5: Yarn A

PATTERN STARTS

Begin by forming a Magic Ring. Ch1, 8tr into the Magic Ring. Pull the ring tight to close the ring, join with a sl st.

Round 1: Ch3, work 1 puff st (see special abbreviations) in ch at the bottom of your ch3, ch 2. *1 puff st in the next st, ch 2* repeat 6 more times until you have 8 puffs forming a flower shape. Join with a sl st into the top of your first puff st.

Round 2: Join your relevant yarn colour to any ch sp (in between the puff sts) of Round 1.

Ch3, 2tr in the same ch sp. *ch1 3tr in the next ch sp, ch 1 (3tr,ch2,3tr) in the next corner*

Repeat twice more times. Ch1, 3tr in the next ch space. Ch1, 3tr in the last ch sp (where you worked the first 3tr) Join with a sl st to the top of your first ch3. Fasten off

Round 3: Join your relevant yarn colour into any corner space. Ch3, 2tr in the same sp.

Ch1, 3tr in the next ch sp, ch1, 3tr in the next ch sp, (3tr,2ch,3tr) in the corner sp Repeat twice more. Ch1, 3tr in next ch sp, ch1, 3tr in next ch sp, ch1, 3tr in last corner sp, join with a sl st to the first ch3 from this round. Fasten off.

Round 4: Join your relevant yarn colour into any corner space. Ch3, 2tr into the same sp. *ch1, 3tr in next ch sp, ch1, 3tr in next ch sp, ch1 (3tr,ch2,3tr) in next corner space* Repeat twice more. Ch1, 3tr in next ch sp, ch1, 3tr in next ch sp, ch1, 3tr in last corner sp, join with a sl st to the first ch3 from this round. Fasten off.

Round 5: Join Yarn A to any corner sp. Ch2 2dc in same ch sp. Work 1dc in the top of each tr and ch space around your square, working (2dc, ch1, 2dc) in each corner. 2dc in the final corner, ch 1, join with a sl st to the first dc of the round. Fasten off.

Once you have made all 40 squares. **Block** each one before you sew them together using Yarn A following chart A for the positioning of each square.

Before your fold your work in half to sew together into your sleeve shape, work the next upper arm section whilst it is a flat piece.

Blocking – Use pins to stretch our each square and spray lightly with water. Leave in position until dry.

















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SLEEVES

Upper Arm (worked with arm flat before it is seamed together)

Row 1: Attach Yarn A to the Corner of your work RS facing. Work 1dc in each st along (94sts)

Row 2: Ch1, *1dc, 1dc, 2dctog* Repeat until the end of the row (74sts)

Fasten off leaving a long tail to attach sleeve to the jacket.

Cuff

Once your sleeve has been sewn together

Working in the round (to pinch in the cuff)

Round 1: Attach Yarn A to the corner of your work RS facing. Work 1 dc in each st around, join with a sl st (94sts)

Round 2: Ch1, *1dc, 1dc, dc2tog* repeat around your cuff, join with a sl st (71sts)

Round 3: Ch1, *dc2tog, 1dc, dc2tog* repeat around your cuff, 1dc in the last st, join with a sl st (47sts)

Round 4: Ch1, 1dc in each st, join with a sl st (47 sts)

Round 5: ch1, 1 sl st in each st around, join with a sl st.

Fasten off.

Repeat this process for the second sleeve.

Use the Tailors Awl for punching holes into the cuff to reattach (if required).

SLEEVES

Attaching your sleeves (to the jacket)

Attaching your sleeve to the jacket. Evenly measure and mark 74 sts along the seam of your jacket (ensure this number corresponds with your final stitch count in Round 2 of the Upper Arm section).

Use the Tailors Awl to punch holes evenly along the seam ready to sew on your sleeve. Place your sleeve over the jacket seam and sew on through the holes you have just punched. Ensure you are evenly matching up the stitches so you don't cause any gathering.

BACK SQUARES (Optional)

Make 5 squares as follows:

Square 1: R1: Yarn B R2: Yarn E R3: Yarn A Square 2: R1: Yarn G R2: Yarn H R3: Yarn A Square 3: R1: Yarn H R2: Yarn J R3: Yarn A Square 4: R1: Yarn E R2: Yarn D R3: Yarn A Square 5: R1: Yarn C R2: Yarn F R3: Yarn A

Begin by forming a Magic Ring. Ch1, 8tr into the Magic Ring. Pull the ring tight to close the ring, join with a sl st. **Round 1:** Ch3, work 1 puff st (see special abbreviations) in ch at the bottom of your ch3, ch 2. *1 puff st in the next st, ch 2* repeat 6 more times until you have 8 puffs forming a flower shape. Join with a sl st into the top of your first puff.

Round 2: Join your relevant yarn colour to any ch sp (in between the cl sts) of Round 1. Ch3, 2tr in the same ch sp. *ch1 3tr in the next ch sp, ch 1 (3tr,ch2,3tr) in the next corner* Repeat twice more times. Ch1, 3tr in the next ch space. Ch1, 3tr in the last ch sp (where you worked the first 3tr) Join with a sl st to the top of your first ch3. Fasten off

Round 3: Join Yarn A to any corner sp. Ch2 2dc in same ch sp. Work 1dc in the top of each tr and ch space around your square, working (2dc, ch1, 2dc) in each corner. 2dc in the final corner, ch 1, join with a sl st to the first dc of the round. Fasten off.

Sew your squares spaced evenly into your desired position on the reverse of your jacket using Yarn A.











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
